

**Title:** Google Guides Map

**Description:** The Google Guides map was used to evenly disperse our “Google Guides” around the campus, and to then have an easy method to look up and contact these Google Guides as we made the migration to Google. Its implementation was easy and just required a little know how on the mapping possibilities given to us by the company.

We first collected the Google Guides information from a Google form and sheet that was filled in by those that were interested in being innovative and have first dibs on the new technology that was coming to the campus. Once that was done we imported the data into Google Fusion charts and gave each location a generic Geo-location so that we had the building pinpointed, but not the room number, so as not to intrude on the users’ privacy too much more.

As we’ve now made the migration, the links made available to the users no longer link to an active listing. The links used an existing system we already had in place to list the users details, and with authentication the users could gain more information about the particular Google Guide they were interested in contacting.
