### What is Dual Enrollment?

In Dual Enrollment, high school students can earn community college credit and high school credit at the same time. Your high school teacher is Dual Enrollment-certified and you may transfer your college credit to any Maricopa Community College or to a public in-state university. Dual Enrollment credits can be used towards a degree program certificate or transferred to an in-state university.

### What Are the Benefits of Dual Enrollment?

- **Prepare for College** — You'll get to experience the academic expectations of college courses in the reassuring environment of your high school classroom. It's a fantastic opportunity to experience higher education without worrying about adjusting to college life on a busy campus.

### Participating In Dual Enrollment

- **Who Can Participate?**  
Certain classes may be restricted by grade level. Talk to your high school counselor for more information about Dual Enrollment, available courses, and applying.
- **How Do I Enroll?**  
Your high school will distribute Dual Enrollment information, including instructions on applying for admission, testing requirements, and registration forms. Again, your high school counselor will be able to give you more information.
- **How Much is Tuition?**  
Currently, at \$97 per credit hour, our tuition is among the lowest you'll find. It's a fantastic value and can save you tens of thousands of dollars over the course of earning a degree. You may qualify for a Dual Enrollment grant or other tuition assistance based on financial need.
